Gesellschaftsrecht II / Principles of Corporate Law – Autumn Semester 2022

Course Leader: Professor Dr Kern Alexander

Introduction

The course will examine the main principles of corporate law from a comparative perspective. In doing so, the major principles and doctrines of corporate law in selected common and civil law jurisdictions be analyzed. The areas covered include 'why do we have companies?', shareholder rights, directors' duties, agency problems and corporate governance, limited liability, capital raising, insider dealing and market misconduct. The EU legal principles of free movement and shareholder rights will be covered. Specific themes including minority shareholder protection, compensation, corporate formation and personality, corporate social responsibility and employee rights will be explored along with the role of auditors and rating agencies. The case law method and case studies will be used to highlight key points.

Course Structure

The course will consist of lecture sessions that utilized the case law method and interactive discussion of key lecture topics derived from the readings and elaborated upon in class. The required readings and relevant documentation will be available to be downloaded from the course readings page on the course website (website link). Students should read the mandatory readings for each week's lecture and come to class ready to participate. The final lecture will include an examination review session that will cover relevant course themes and topics. The examination will be written and open book. Students will be encouraged to discuss course themes and materials in preparation for the examination.

Syllabus

The syllabus will be continually updated throughout the semester (usually minor changes). The most current version will be available on the chair's website with an indication of the date of revision. A more detailed syllabus will be uploaded to the course website on 1st September 2022.

Assessment

Written examination (open book exam).
