1. Please explain the content of the “poverty of stimulus” argument. Please give an example from a cognitive domain other than morality, including the non-moral cognitive faculties of non-human animals. Why is this argument important for the understanding of human moral cognition? **(30%)**
2. Moral evaluation is often associated with emotions. Please outline two different theoretical approaches to the role of emotions for moral judgement. **(20%)**
3. What speaks for, what against a “Universal Moral Grammar”? **(30%)**
4. What is “evolutionary psychology”? What assumptions about the forces that shape the evolution of organism are crucial for this theoretical approach? Does it explain convincingly the evolution of moral cognition? Which alternative approaches to the evolution of moral cognition do you know? **(20%)**
