It uses over 100 policy indicators to create a rich, multidimensional picture of migrants' opportunities to participate in European societies. This site presents the results of the second edition of the MIPEX, covering six policy areas which shape a migrant's journey to full citizenship.

Number of permanent residence permits tumble after points system implemented.

Only five foreigners have been granted permanent residency since June, when a points system replaced the old rule requiring only seven years of residency to qualify.

If you have held a Danish temporary residence permit for at least four years, you can apply for a permanent residence permit. With a permanent residence permit, you no longer need to apply for an extension of your residence permit but can reside in Denmark for as long as you wish, provided you meet certain conditions.
