## European Economic Law Examination

- **1.** The class on European Economic Law is completed by a written 2 hour exam. The general faculty rules on exams apply.
- **2.** The examination will be in English. You have to give your answers in English, too. Please write legibly. The exam is not a test of your English language skills which will not be part of the evaluation.
- **3.** The examination will have one or several sections. You have to respond to all of them.
- **4.** Only legal texts are admitted in the examination. You should bring the following texts in any official language of the EU:
  - EC/EU Treaty
  - Regulation 1/2003
  - Regulation 139/2004 (EC Merger Regulation)

Furthermore, collections of European law or competition law are admitted even if they contain other legal texts than those indicated above, e.g.:

- Kaddous/Picod, Union européenne/Communauté européenne, Recueil des textes
- dtv-Sammlung Europarecht: EuR
- dtv-Sammlung EU-Vertrag: EUV

- Roland Bieber, Europarecht (Nomos)
